Yes, I love almost all kinds of books including love stories, wuxia stories (武俠小說) and detective stories etc.

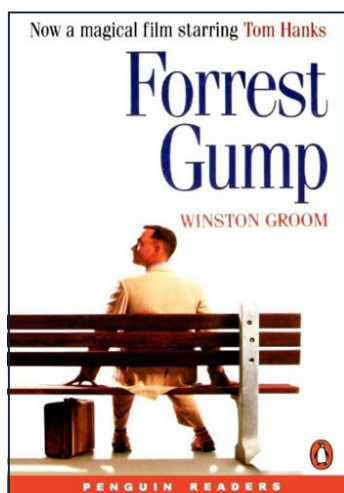
### So, it seems to me that you like reading fictions a lot. Am I right?

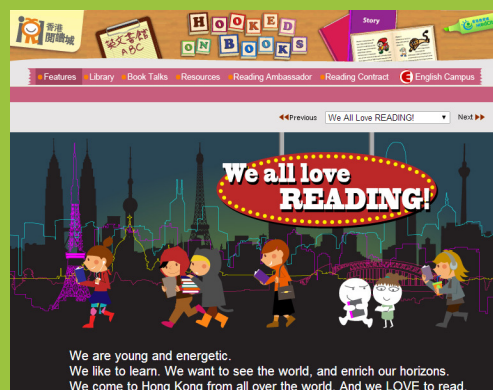

# Teachers' Recommendations

## A Book about School Shooting Nineteen Minutes

Recommended by Mr. Kwan Cheuk Yin

Have you ever encountered bullying? You are very lucky if you have not. Peter is an American boy who studies in high school and is constantly bullied.

One day, this once obedient boy took an arsenal of guns, not books or school bags, to school. He started shooting his schoolmates and teachers for nineteen minutes. Nineteen minutes is a very short period of time, it's no longer than a recess. In those nineteen minutes, he

killed several people and injured many others. He was then caught by the police and was sentenced life in prison.

After the incident, his mother could not believe what her son had done. Everybody pointed their fingers at Peter and called him "evil". But nobody cared to know and find out why Peter had changed from a normal school boy to a killer. In fact, it was the bullies which changed Peter so much and the loss of love from his parents that intensified his stress.

Throughout the book, time flashes back and forth between events before and after the shooting. Readers would know the past that changed Peter and the shooting in school. The writer of the book is Jodi

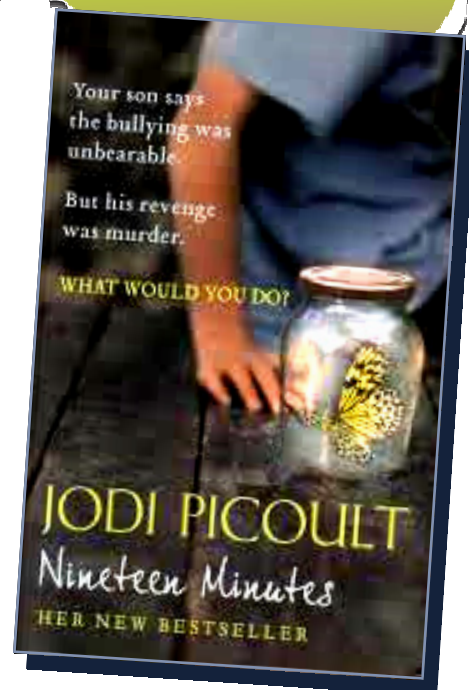


School shooting is a major problem in high school in the United States. Reasons behind are worth thinking. Jodi's novel may inspire you a deeper thinking.



Picoult. In the book, Jodi unfolds important events of Peter and his friends to illustrate their personalities and relationship.

The Hong Kong government implies strict measures on gun possession. Therefore, school shooting is almost impossible unless there are any amendments in the related ordinances. However, other types of bullying like online and peer abuses are common. If you have bullied anybody, I urge you to stop because you won't know when you may trigger your targets and the consequences can be so enormous that you cannot bear. If you have been bullied, tell the bully to stop or talk to your friends and parents. Let's learn from the novel "Nineteen minutes" until it is too late.

## Great Work of Jodi Picoult

### My Sister's Keeper

"My Sister's Keeper" is another best-selling novel written by Jodi Picoult and was published in 2004. In the book, Jodi told a story of a 13-year-old girl called Anna. The book has been adapted into a movie of the same name and was released in 2009.

Poster of the movie ***My Sister's Keeper*** which released on 2009. In the novel, Anna was a "savior sister", whom was brought into the world for the purpose of organ transplantation to her elder sister.



Like “Nineteen Minutes”, “My Sister’s Keeper” raised public concerns of controversial issues which involve organ transplantation, love and bonds between family members. In the book, Anna, who has a sister that suffered from leukemia(白血病), was brought to the world as a savior sister. When Anna turned 13, she decided to sue her parents for medical emancipation and the rights to her own body.

The movie was aired in 2009 and drew immediate attention from various book critics. It is directed by Nick Cassavetes, who is the director of another famous adapted movie “The Notebook”. The film featured Cameron Diaz as Anna’s mother. Cameron is a four-time nominee in Golden Globe Award and won the New York Film Critics Best Lead

Actress Award. The movie received top 5 in its opening and grossed USD\$95,660,157 worldwide when it left theatres.

There were a few changes made by the director in the movies, the most drastic one being the ending in which Anna was dead after a car accident in the novel, while Kate was dead from cancer in the movie. Would any changes made in the movie discourage you from watching it? Feel free to come and tell me what you think!

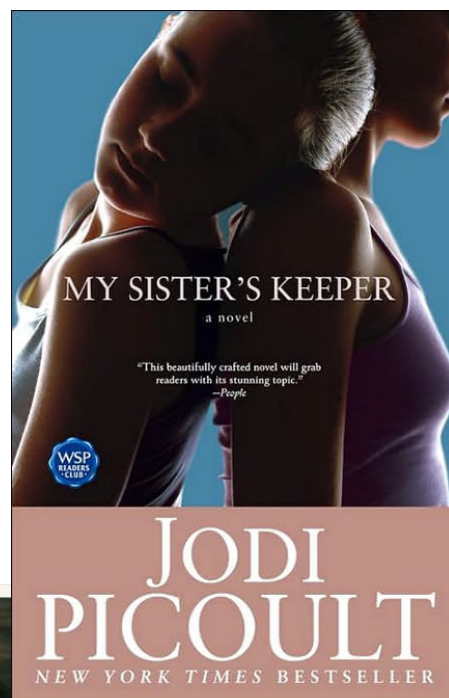
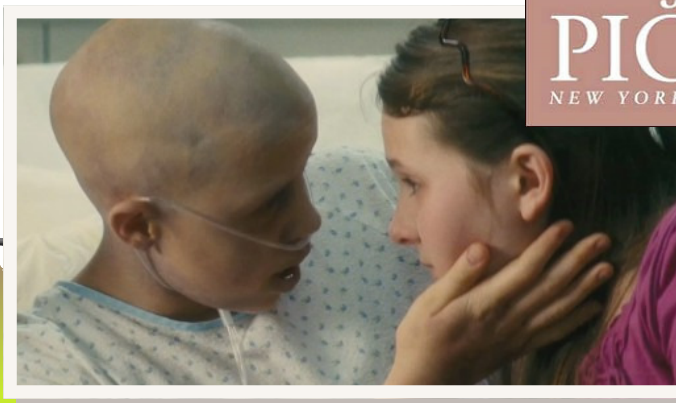

# Life of Pi

Recommended by Ms. To Tin Yui

I am grateful to share a book with you all. This is a famous, interesting and heatedly-debated story. The story is written by a well-known Canadian author, Yann Martel. The main character in the story is called Piscine Molitor Patel, a young boy who grows up in a family running a small zoo in India. His classmates call him Pi, in short.

Pi is an interesting boy who believes in Hindu, Indian Gods, Jesus Christ and Mary, mother of God, and also he is an Islam. He thinks that all religions are true, and he finds peace and satisfaction in them.

When Pi is 16 years old, his family plans to move from India to Canada, together with the zoo animals. One night when they are on the ship, there is a terrible storm. Pi soon finds himself on a lifeboat with a zebra, a hyena (a wild animal like a dog), a chimpanzee, and a tiger named Richard Parker. They have no choice but to stay on the lifeboat and wait for help. So here the story begins. After the tiger finishes eating the other animals, Pi and the tiger are the only survivors.



Pi survived the terrible storm with the zoo animals, including a tiger.





For seven months, Pi and the tiger stay alive because Pi works to provide food and water for them both. Pi also trains the tiger to respect him and stay in his own part of the boat. Finally they land in Mexico, and the tiger runs off into the forest.



What do you prefer to believe? Tiger survived by eating other animals? Or Pi survived by eating other people?

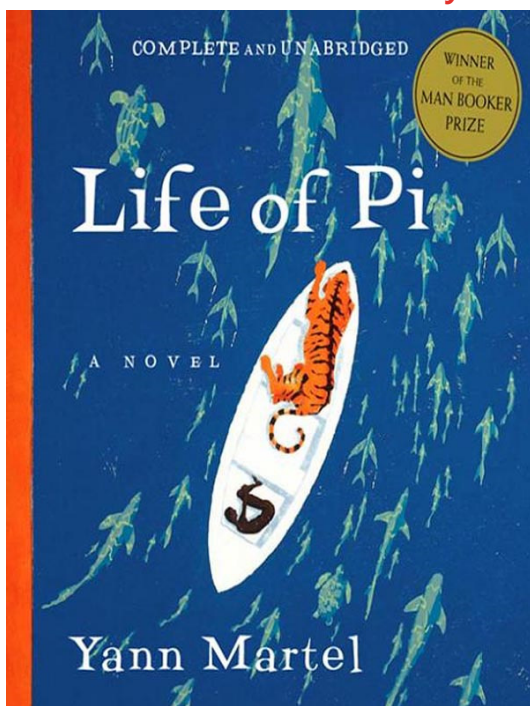
This can be only an adventure story of animals. But there are debates on the story that Pi tells the others. One story is about the tiger eating the zoo animals. Another story is that there are only humans on the boat, but not the animals. So the true story might be Pi eating the other people, including his mother, in order to stay alive. Pi said that, if you believe in the story of animals, you believe in God. What if you believe in the man-eating-man version? For me, this is like you believe in the reality, something sad, but something true. What would you do if you were Pi? Starve yourself to death, or would you eat your mother to stay alive?

## 「九龍城書節」簡介

首屆「九龍城書節」於2009年舉辦。有別於一般書展，「九龍城書節」以多元、互動、文化氣息濃厚為主要特色。除了會廣邀出版社及書局參與書展外，亦會有「公民地攤」，讓市民進行二手物或手工藝品買賣。書展期間亦有多場講座、工作坊、展覽及表演等活動，使參加者在購買書籍之餘亦可了解公民社會、文化藝術議題，擴闊視野。

「九龍城書節」是香港文化界一年一度的盛事，至今已至第五屆舉行。本年度以「閱讀生活」為題，意義有兩個層次：一方面主辦者希望香港人在日常生活中能養成閱讀的習慣；另一方面生活就像一本大書，值得我們發掘當中的細節和趣味。本校閱讀推廣組於 2013 年 12 月就帶領部份同學到訪香港兆基創意書院，參觀「九龍城書節」，不知同學當中又發掘到什麼趣味呢？

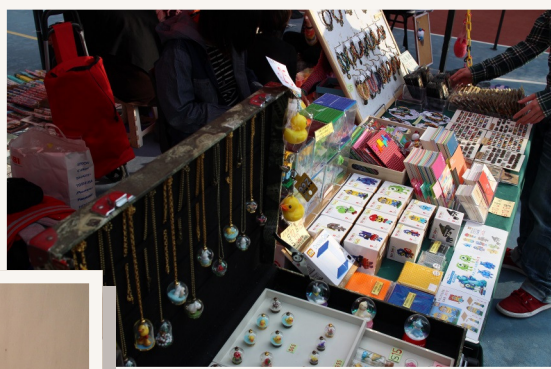
校園內有不少裝置藝術，而售賣工藝的地攤遍佈每個角落。（本頁背景）

# 怎樣寫好閱書報告

閱讀報告又稱讀後感，顧名思義，是在閱讀後寫下自己的感受和體會的文章。既然稱為「報告」，自然得在文章中介紹書本內容，說說自己的反思感悟。一般而言，閱讀報告都沒有指定格式，結構上和一般文章無異，大致上可以分為「引入」、「正文」和「總結」三個部份。

## 引入

- **從旁入手**：先說說自己對某件事的看法，再帶出書本內容。
- **開門見山**：單刀直入地說明對選讀作品的看法，或直接了當說明選讀作品給予自己的啟發，接著展開下文的具體論證。
- **引用句子**：引用自己最喜歡書中的句子，或引經據典，帶出書本的主題。
- **故弄玄虛**：以問題起筆，引起懸念，吸引讀者的閱讀興趣；接著可以作品內容或日常生活作說明，引入討論，帶出自己的想法。

## 正文

- 簡單交代作品故事大綱，再分析作者的人生態度。
- 通過自問自答的設問手法，層層深入地說明了自己對書中人物的理解或對作者立場的看法。
- 對選讀作品中的觀點及道理論證逐一進行反駁；也可運用反問的手法點出選讀作品的觀點及論證過程有不合理之處。
- 引用作品中人物角色的說話，分析人物性格及評鑑作者的人物塑造手法。
- 分析小說類作品的寫作手法時，除了可以從人物塑造入手外，也可以分析小說當中的場面描寫、環境布置、氣氛渲染等方面的特點。
- 簡單交代小說情節，並通過描寫角色的經歷，抒發自己從中獲得的體

## 總結

- 由此及彼，在文章最後聯繫到自身，加強自己與書中人物的共鳴。
- 問句作結，韻味悠長，令人深思，啟發讀者思考。
- 重申論點，突出文章主題，與文章開首互相呼應。



## 避免常犯錯誤！

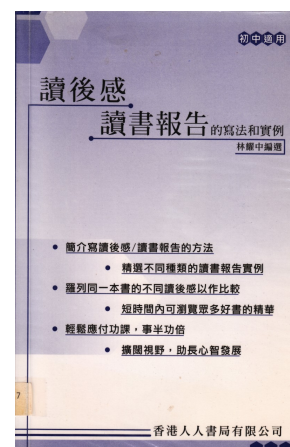
要寫好一篇閱讀報告，除了掌握上文所說的結構及技巧外，避免以下常犯錯誤也可以提升閱讀報告的質素。

常犯錯誤	解決方法
<b>囿 評語空泛：</b> 以「很好看」、「給我深刻的感受」、「值得推薦」、「令我學會了很多道理」作為評語。	<b>✓ 解釋拓展：</b> 「很好看」即有多好看？適當地引用故事情節或精彩句子不但能充實報告內容，而且它們本身就是讀後感的有力論據。
<b>囿 比例失衡：</b> 大篇幅寫個人感受或概括書本內容，令報告看似是書本內容撮要或個人心情隨筆。	<b>✓ 讀感結合：</b> 感受必須以書本內容為根本。我們可以列舉日常生活或個人經歷的例子和書中故事情節或作者感受作比較。
<b>囿 欠缺反思：</b> 只是抄錄書本封底簡介的不完整陳述。更甚者，只簡述文章內容，又或把故事情節撮寫一次，完全而沒有交代個人感受。	<b>✓ 認真閱讀：</b> 要有個人反思，必須先認真閱讀，不可只是翻翻序跋目錄就當自己讀完一本書。先準確理解書本的主題思想，思考作者的寫作目的，然後才談感受，寫評價。
<b>囿 無感可寫</b> 書本情節沉悶或內容過淺或內涵過於單薄等等，根本想不到有什麼可以寫。有些書內容牽涉太多太深，又或題材太冷僻，即使認真閱讀、想寫讀後感，也不知道如何入手。	<b>✓ 廣泛閱讀：</b> 平日宜廣泛閱讀不同類型的圖書，發掘自己的閱讀喜好之餘，亦擴闊自己對不同書種的接受能力。如果所選書本真的想不到可以寫什麼，那就轉看另一本書吧。選書時，可選一些與自己生活經驗有關的圖書，例如有關中學校園生活的小說、關注香港發展的評論集等。

這一期先介紹這些寫閱讀報告的小技巧，下一期《喜閱》再和大家分析一些我校同學的佳作，給各位同學來做個示範。同學如想認識更多撰寫閱讀報告的技巧和方法，可以到圖書館借閱以下兩本參考圖書。

# 荒誕的真實 政治諷刺小說介紹

「國慶日前，天安門地區將換上『新裝』，整體環境煥然一新。……其中新地的石材比以前增厚近一倍，由原來的 8 厘米增至 15 厘米，抗碾壓能力更強。」這是 2012 年 9 月中旬《京華時報》的一則新聞，就是這樣一篇四平八穩的官樣報導，竟然在新浪微博上被瘋狂轉發了五千多次，因為，在有心的大陸網友眼裏：「最後一句亮了！」

以上的段落來自最近閱讀的一本書《你永遠都無法叫醒一個裝睡的人》（周濂著），在今天的內地社會、甚至是香港，因為政治社會環境的扭曲，使用中文的人被迫變得愈來愈有創意，在內地，沒有「遊行」，只有「散步」；六月四日並不存在，只有「五月三十五日」。

這樣運用文字荒誕麼？還遠不及今天的社會荒誕。法律淪為保障權貴利益的工具，自由民主等人類基本權益成為峨大冠、坐高堂者的施捨……

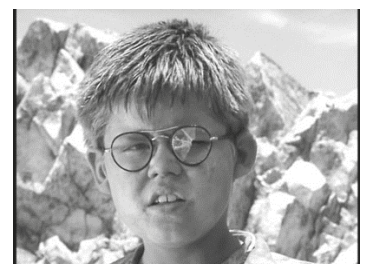
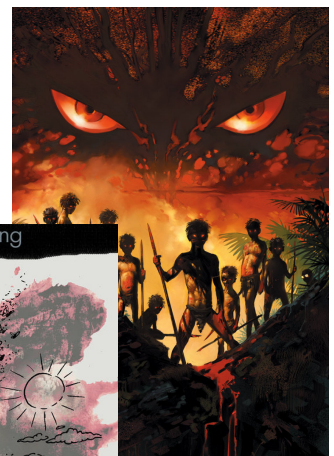
此刻回看歷史上經典的政治諷刺寓言小說，一一成為最真實的報告文學。所謂「諷刺」據詞典解釋是「用比喻、誇張等手法對人或事進行揭露、批評或嘲笑。」（《現代漢語詞典》）當我們面對現實的黑暗與苦悶，未能直接提出控訴，但又如鯁在喉不吐不快；又或者希望透過嘲諷等方式使控訴更為有力，各類的諷刺小說便應運而生了。以下是幾本合適同學閱讀的心水推介。

## 蒼蠅王（Lord of the Flies）

作者：威廉·高汀（英國）

同學小時可能都閱讀過《金銀島》，敘述了小孩向大海進發的冒險故事，說的是友誼與勇氣。但《蒼蠅王》也是敘述小孩於荒島求生，卻是一個純潔小孩墮落的故事。故事中的一群小孩來自以注重禮儀見稱的英國，因戰爭而被安排乘船往澳洲避難，但途中遇上海難，在沒有成人的情況下流落荒島。起初這群小孩以民主方式推舉其中最成熟的一位擔任領袖，建立起互相照顧的秩序，但在充滿危機的野外環境中，小孩間漸漸受恐懼、私心、原始的暴力野性所驅使，使原有的秩序日漸崩潰，最終更使他們互相殘殺……到底殘害他們的，是荒島惡劣的環境、還是人類天性中的心魔？故事中最後小孩獲得前來救援的成人解放，又象徵了什麼？現實中的人類，又有什麼救贖呢？



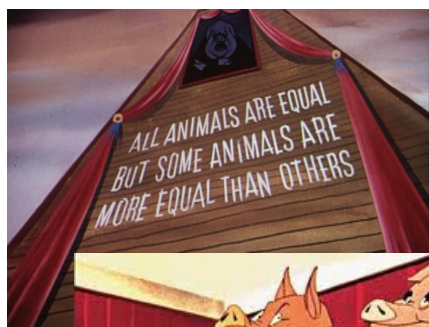

## 1984

以下介紹的兩本均為英國作家喬治·歐威爾的經典小說。《一九八四》敘述的是 1984 年（小說寫於 1948 年）世界只剩下三個超級大國，而故事的主角溫斯頓在其中一國大洋國「真理部」從事篡改歷史工作，因對其所處的社會和領袖「老大哥」產生懷疑，成為思想犯，在經歷「友愛部」的思想改造之後最終成為了「思想純潔者」。故事中所描述的世界，只要國家說「 $1+1=3$ 」是真理，人民就深信不疑，即使主角負責的正是將「 $1+1=2$ 」的證據銷毀，他也沒辦法使任何人產生對國家的動搖。還有更多更荒誕而又寫實的情節在小說中一一描述，看過這本小說後，你會否更珍惜說出「 $1+1=2$ 」的自由？

而《動物農莊》似乎情節比較有趣，仿如電影《寶貝小豬嘜》一樣，農莊的小動物全都賦予了人性，能說話能思想，但其實也是諷刺現實的故事。農莊的動物為了爭取平等，驅逐了勞役他們的人類主人，建立每種動物都平等的國度，而豬當上了牠們的領袖。可是隨故事的發展，最終「所有動物都是平等」的最高教條，變成了「所有動物都是平等，然而有些動物比其他動物更平等」。這不正是當今社會的最佳寫照嗎？寫知道動物農莊的最終下場，就從書中去發掘吧！
